1 I, STACY D. PHILLIPS, declare as follows:

2 1. I am an attorney licensed to practice in the State of California and am a partner of
3 Phillips, Lerner, Lauzon & Jamra, L.L.P. ("PLLJ"). If called as a witness, I could and would
4 competently testify to the facts stated herein.

5 2. I am a Certified Family Law Specialist. I have been practicing family law
6 exclusively for the past twenty-two plus (22+) years. During this time, I have handled a
7 multitude of high profile litigants. I state this only because there are issues that are involved in
8 such representations that are relevant in this matter. I have attached as **Exhibit "A"** my
9 Curriculum Vitae should the Court wish to review my credentials. My hourly rate is \$700.00.

10 3. On February 14, 2008, I was retained as Family Law Counsel for James P.
11 Spears, Temporary Conservator of the Person of Britney J. Spears and Temporary Co-
12 Conservator with Andrew Wallet for Ms. Spears' Estate. On February 19, 2008, Commissioner
13 Scott Gordon, presiding Judge Pro Tem in the Family Law matter BD 455 662, *Marriage of*
14 *Spears and Federline*, granted the request of Trope & Trope, prior counsel for the Conservatee,
15 to be relieved of representation and officially substituted PLLJ as attorneys of record for Ms.
16 Spears, by and through her Temporary Conservator of the Person, James P. Spears, and her
17 Temporary Co- Conservators of the Estate, James P. Spears and Andrew M. Wallett, Esq.

18 4. In the within declaration, I address the legal services performed in this matter for
19 the benefit of the Temporary Co-Conservators from March 26, 2008 through June 24, 2008¹
20 when the family law matter officially transitioned to attorney Laura Wasser of Wasser,
21 Cooperman and Carter. Although I am accustomed to preparing fee declarations in the Family
22 Law Court, I have not prepared a fee declaration for the Probate Court in any other matter. With
23 limited guidance, I am providing the Court with a summary description of the services PLLJ
24 performed in the post-Judgment action.

28 ¹ PLLJ was orally terminated by the Temporary Co-Conservators of the Estate on June 10, 2008. Despite
this decision, at the request of the Co-Conservators and because new counsel was not yet retained, PLLJ continued
to perform legal services for 14 days after termination as set forth below.

1 with me on telephonic conference calls with me and opposing counsel, with me, the Family Law
2 Court and opposing counsel, and with me, opposing counsel and the custodial evaluator, and with
3 me, opposing counsel and another professional. The associate was present and took notes for the
4 express purpose of "witnessing and documenting" the discussion and decisions made in each
5 conference/meeting for the "Team." These notes would then be used to prepare a detailed
6 memorandum. In the beginning, I tried to do this alone, but I found I was not able to focus on the
7 issues, take detailed notes and then draft the memorandum in a timely fashion. The preparation
8 of the memos was at the request of the Team.

9 9. Approximately (19) nineteen memorandums were prepared and circulated.
10 Indeed, the Family law action necessitated a "Team" of Family and Probate attorneys working in
11 concert. At times, I felt that my "hands were tied" implicitly and explicitly by the Family Law
12 Court to keep certain information and documents confidential- even from the Probate counsel
13 and Mr. Wallet.

14 10. The layers of cross-review, cross-analysis and cross-communication increased the
15 time our office spent on this matter exponentially and gave this case a distinctly different quality
16 than any of my other dissolution and custody matters. I estimate that at least 40% of the
17 Conservatee's fees owed to PLLJ are a direct result of the cost of the requirements of the unique
18 matrix representation described herein.

19 11. In addition to the persons described above, we were required to consult from time
20 to time with other professionals, including without limitation, PVP counsel for the Conservatee,
21 health professionals, experts and other attorneys.

22 12. In sum, from the inception of my representation of the Temporary Co-
23 Conservators in the Family Law matter, I had to provide extra-ordinary legal services not
24 normally part of my Family Law representation, in addition to the more "typical" management of
25 the core Family Law case. During the month of March 2008, I personally billed over 120 hours
26 to this case alone, sometimes with inattention to the other cases in my case load. In addition,
27 opposing counsel frequently stymied the progress of resolving even the most mundane aspect of
28 Conservatee's custody and created an additional hurdle through which to jump. We frequently

1 had difficulty - indeed, severe difficulty - getting a response from opposing counsel.

2
3 13. When the matter came to our office, the Conservatee had no visitation rights and
4 a custody evaluation was pending. From that position, we created a structure which set the stage
5 for the Conservatee to regain overnight visitation and eventually multiple overnight visitation
6 with the minor children before we transitioned the case to subsequent counsel.

7 **II.**

8 **SUMMARY OF LEGAL SERVICES PERFORMED ON BEHALF OF**
9 **THE TEMPORARY CO-CONSERVATORS**

10 14. Upon request, I am prepared to file a more specific and detailed summary and
11 analysis of the legal services we performed in this matter for this Court to review *in camera*. For
12 the purpose of keeping details of the Conservatee's life and of our work product confidential, I
13 submit the following *summary* of services performed, for the purpose of substantiating the fees
14 and costs incurred.

15 A. **Child Custody.** When we inherited the Family Law case in late February
16 2008, a formal custody evaluation had been on-going since October 2007.

17 a. We performed (with approval and input from the Probate counsel)
18 various tasks in connection with the Court-ordered evaluation, details of which will be provided
19 *in camera* upon request.

20 b. We carefully crafted and negotiated a Stipulation which served as a
21 the foundation for the current custody Orders in effect.

22 c. In satisfaction of the Court's request for information, we prepared
23 and filed in conjunction with opposing counsel³, a Joint Statement of issues for clarification by
24 the Court. This required coordinating with opposing counsel. This document was modified
25 numerous times based on each side's use of additional arguments.

26 d. When the Child Custody Evaluation Report (the "Report") came

1 out on April 25, 2008, we reviewed the lengthy and confidential document⁴ and prepared a
2 shortened, comprehensive summary of the Report.

3 e. Immediately after the Report was disseminated, we arranged and
4 prepared for an informal settlement meeting held at my office with opposing counsel,
5 Respondent and Mr. Spears. After this multi-hour discussion, we continued to negotiate
6 extensively with opposing counsel regarding a mutually agreeable custody plan. We were unable
7 to reach agreement prior to the next scheduled hearing.

8 f. We prepared for and attended a hearing. Prior to ruling, opposing
9 counsel and I formulated an interim settlement of certain immediate issues which was recited on
10 the record in a sealed proceeding. The Court set an evidentiary hearing for the summer of 2008,
11 pending any further settlement.

12 i. We had to continue to revise and negotiate the Order After
13 Hearing prepared by opposing counsel which reflected the agreement placed on the record.
14 Additionally, practical issues would crop up which had not been addressed at the hearing, some
15 of which we were able to negotiate to be included in the Order After Hearing on Mr. Spear's
16 behalf, and others that needed Court intervention.

17 g. From time to time, we negotiated changes relating to the visitation
18 schedule.

19 h. We prepared an *ex parte* application relating to visitation. We
20 prepared and filed pleadings for this application and I made the Court appearance, which
21 required me to return from a pre-honeymoon and attend Court in non-Court attire, even after we
22 had been orally terminated in this matter. We worked in conjunction with Ms. Wasser on this
23 task.

24 15. In total, from March 26, 2008 - June 24, 2008, we billed 632.22 total hours
25 involving custody matters for a total of \$259,300.75. In addition to my rate of \$700.00 per hour,

28 ⁴ The Court disseminated two water-marked copies of the Report to Family Law counsel and ordered that
the Shatz Report not be made available to anyone but the parties, who themselves could not obtain a copy of the
Report. We fought for and succeeded in obtaining an order expanding rights to review the Report.

1 my associate attorney, Robyn Santucci,⁵ whose rate is \$375.00, assisted me in this matter. In
2 addition to holding her Juris Doctorate, Ms. Santucci has a Master's Degree in Clinical
3 Psychology, which has been invaluable in addressing the crossover issues between the Family
4 Law and Probate matter. Additionally, I was assisted by Sharon Stark, who also holds both her
5 Juris Doctorate and a Master's Degree in Psychology, and whose rate is \$365.00. PLLJ's unique
6 position of having associate Family Law counsel with advanced degrees in psychology made it
7 possible for the firm to quickly digest the complex issues appurtenant to the Conservatee's
8 circumstances as they related to custody issues. I additionally used Kelly Gray who was
9 admitted to the California Bar in 1986 and has practiced Family Law exclusively since that time.
10 I have worked with Ms. Gray almost continuously since 1992 and Ms. Gray's hourly rate is
11 \$465.00.

12 **B. Confidentiality of Court Documents.** The Family Law Court issued an
13 Order (the "Sealing Order") specifically detailing the proper procedure which was to be followed
14 in this matter regarding confidential documents. When we received the files in this matter, a
15 significant portion of the pleadings had not been redacted and filed in the Court's file from prior
16 counsel. We also did not receive a complete file. I was ordered in open court to comply with the
17 Sealing Order by a date certain for all documents which had not been properly redacted by prior
18 counsel.

19 16. In addition to coming up to speed quickly by reviewing the file for substance, we
20 had to reconstruct many portions of the file from several sources to comply with the Sealing
21 Order. It became our task to locate the pleadings (filed under seal by predecessor Family Law
22 counsel), determine whether they fell within the ambit of the Sealing Order, and if so, determine
23 what portions to redact, and then meet and confer with opposing counsel to form a consensus
24 about which pleadings and which portions of each pleading to redact. Additionally, we had to
25 review documents which had been already redacted by opposing counsel and determine whether
26

27 ⁵ Ms. Santucci was admitted to the California Bar in 2001. She has worked exclusively in the field of
Family Law. Ms. Santucci began her Family Law career as an associate with the San Francisco firm, Hersh
Family Law Practice. She became an Associate Attorney of Phillips, Lerner, Lauzon & Jamra, L.L.P. in June
2006.

1 we had any disagreements with opposing counsel's proposed redactions. The redacted
2 documents were filed as a bundle with a separate Stipulation and Order filed for each bundle of
3 documents, all of which our office prepared.

4 17. In total, from March 26, 2008 - June 24, 2008, we billed 18.4 total hours involving
5 redacting and sealing of confidential documents, for a total of \$5,428. I assigned the task of
6 redacting both the historic and the "go forward" documents to associate attorney, Karnig (Greg)
7 Dukmajian, the most junior associate in my firm. Mr. Dukmajian's hourly rate is \$270.00.

8 C. Additional Miscellaneous Issues. From March 26, 2008 to June 24, 2008,
9 we billed approximately 67.9 total hours for a total of \$16,456, involving confidential matters.
10 Details of the numerous activities will be provided to this Court *in camera* upon request. My
11 time was billed at \$700.00 per hour. Robyn Santucci's time was billed at \$375.00 per hour.

12 D. Gag Order: We drafted and brought an *ex parte* application to clarify the
